## The AIR Program Contractual Understanding

The American Indian Recruitment Program is a mentorship/tutoring program. It is aimed at helping American Indian middle school and high school students who may be interested in attending a higher education and improving their current academics. The mentorship/tutorial program gives our students tutorial help, orientation to University campus life, research and study skills workshops, examination of health and society issues that may affect them in college, and group interaction. The AIR program is held on the campuses of SDSU, the University of San Diego, CSUSM and the University of California San Diego. The program meets on various days within the week depending on which program you are working with. Our Mentors/Tutors will be working with the high school students for a two-hour period. American Indian middle school and high school students statistically have a higher drop-out rate than most and have one of the lowest graduation rates among all races. The aim of the program is to help those individuals who demonstrate the commitment to succeed in their current academics and pursue higher education. Using our resources at our partnered universities, and guidance from dedicated mentors and tutors, we have the opportunity to promote the success of these students within the program.

As mentors we have the opportunity to help promote the success of these students both within their current educational programs and within the higher educational environment. The success of the program relies to a large extent on the mentors and tutors dedication and willingness to work with the high school student. The AIR program must require that the mentors and tutors meet a certain standard to help ensure the success of the high school students. We ask that all mentors adhere to the requirements and the AIR Program Rules and Guidelines contained and outlined within the AIR Program Mentor Handbook.
