## AIR Fall Semester Complete!

The news that the AIR Program completed the Fall semester (2008) is great news, but more important, the AIR Program has completed one full year under a federal grant. The AIR Program has always maintained one program, what is called AIR Sr., but through an Administration of Native Americans Grant, the AIR Program was able to create two new programs AIR Jr. (servicing Native students 6th through 8th grades) and AIR tutorial (that specifically serves to tutor Native students). Through these developed programs the AIR Program, during the 2008 year, has been able to provide academic services to over a hundred Native students within the San Diego County region.

The Fall semester had a rocky start this year, due in part to pending funding and budget cuts, however, the AIR Program staff was able to pull off a successful semester in all three programs. The AIR Jr. program was modified to address the rocky start and it turned our to be a good semester, overall.



The AIR Jr. and Sr. programs, during the Fall semester, was to develope mini-films on what they accomplished during the semester. The overall film was to be derived from their research and experiance of their semester within the AIR Program project. Well, it didnt turn out to be exactly that way but there was enough film footage to put together a mini-documentary style film. No Oscars or Academy Awards for anyone this year.

Currently, we are finallizing all three programs for the Spring 2009 semester. All programs are slated to start in February 2009. Each program will work on the same principals that the AIR Program has had since its conception, provide academic serivices and enrichment to our American Indian communities.
